## CIRCULAR CSSF 06/265

concerning draft law 5627 relating, *inter alia*, to the transposition into Luxembourg law of Directive 2004/39/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 21 April 2004 on markets in financial instruments (MIFID Directive)

Ladies and Gentlemen,

We are pleased to refer to the aforementioned draft law relating, *inter alia*, to the transposition into Luxembourg law of the MIFID Directive, given the consequences that these new rules will have on the functioning of the professionals of the financial sector, on the use of the European passport, as well as on the functioning of the financial markets. We invite you to consult this draft law on the website of the *Chambre des Députés* www.chd.lu, section *Portail documentaire*  $\rightarrow$  *Rôle des Affaires*  $\rightarrow$  *Projets de loi*  $\rightarrow$   $n^{\circ}$  *dossier* 5627, in order to familiarise yourselves with the new requirements in this field and to appraise to what extent your institution will be affected by them. Furthermore, insofar as your institution is concerned, we recommend that you take, where necessary, the strategic and organisational measures allowing you to best prepare for the concrete implementation of the new requirements.

By virtue of the MIFID Directive, the new requirements shall be transposed into national law by 31 January 2007 at the latest and will take effect as of 1 November 2007.
